Acceptance of T & C's It is understood by East Coast Coaches that all T&C's are accepted by the passenger when a deposit is paid.

Bookings Cancellations and Refunds Bookings can be made by completing a booking form and returning it to Doyle's Coaches with the required deposit. Reservations can only be held for 7days without deposit. Final Payment is due 30 Days prior to departure. East Coast Coaches retains the right to cancel a tour due to insufficient numbers or unforeseen circumstances. In this instance either a substitute date or full refund will be offered.

Cancellation Policy The following fees apply according to notice given— 30 days prior to departure of tour, forfeit of deposit only 21 days or less full forfeit. Where a non-refundable ticket has been purchased this will be in addition to cancellation fee.

Tour Costs Tour Prices are current at time of Printing but subject to change without notice for unforeseen circumstances such as, Higher motel costs, Venues closing and replacing them with more expensive venues. All tour costs include GST. Tour price excludes drinks, telephone calls, mini bars, insurance and personal items.

General Conditions Seats cannot be reserved on tours. However, It is East Coast Coaches policy to rotate seats daily to ensure all passengers will enjoy seating.

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4 Day Bellingen and Beyond

Day 1: BRISBANE TO BELLINGEN

Welcome aboard the *East Coast Coaches* tour to *Bellingen*, and the *Dorrigo National Park*. This morning we travel south on the Pacific Highway onto *Ballina*. Our lunch stop is at *Summerland, House with No Steps* - a beautiful working farm set on 172 acres of macadamia and avocado trees. Established in 1971, Summerland House is nestled amongst fertile farmland on the Alstonville Plateau. We have the opportunity to take a walk through the manicured gardens and see the stunning variety of plants in the garden centre and wander through the historic "Watts Cottage" museum. This afternoon we arrive in *Bellingen* and settle into our accommodation which is where we will stay for the next three nights, so get comfortable. Dinner tonight is in the lodge.

Day 2: BELLINGEN AND SOUTHWEST ROCKS

After breakfast we set off to explore the area. We take a look around the historic township of *Bellingen* with its craft shops and galleries. Nestled on the banks of the beautiful Bellingen River, it was once the centre of a thriving timber industry. The town's traditional-style main street, the highlight of which is the restored Hammond and Wheatley Emporium, is as grand as its name suggests. Mid-morning we travel south to visit *South West Rocks*, which was not established until 1896 and grew slowly around the mouth of the Macleay River. We make an interesting visit to the *Trial Bay Gaol*. Work on the gaol commenced in 1877 as an experiment in penal reform. It was constructed of locally quarried pink and gray granite with the first wing being completed in 1886. It was then closed in 1903 but reopened in 1915 to hold internees from Germany as a result of World War I, where they were allowed out onto the beaches during the day but locked up at night. Following our *guided tour* we progress to Nambucca where we can see the mosaic murals and have lunch. Not far away is the township of *Urunga* and this is where we will stop this afternoon. Urunga's timber boardwalk now runs for almost 1km from the Urunga Township to the Pacific Ocean. A perfect way to end the day is our visit to the *Honey Place* also in Urunga where we take a look at the display hive and do a tasting, allowing some time to browse in the shop.

Day 03: DORRIGO

(BLD)

Our touring today takes us along the magnificent *Waterfall Way* and into the *Dorrigo National Park* to see some amazing rainforest country and stunning views. The Skywalk especially will provide an outlook over the coast and to the Pacific Ocean. After lunch in the Canopy Café, we head back down the Valley where we visit *The Old Butter Factory* which now houses a number of shops and galleries. Arriving at the Lodge we have time to freshen up before dinner.

Day 04 (BD): HEADING HOME

Time to check-out and farewell our friendly hosts. Once again we have chosen a couple of interesting venues for our stops throughout the day. Firstly we arrive at the *Wombah Coffee Plantation*, the World's southern-most coffee plantation. Established 1982 by two ladies, Joan Dibden and Joy Phelps, who still own and manage the plantation and process the coffee from berry to roasted to a packaged coffee. The coffee is produced from the finest Arabica coffee trees, grown in the Northern Rivers of New South Wales. The trees are seedlings of original coffee trees brought to the area over 100 years ago. Here we enjoy morning tea and get to sample some of the coffee before we set off along the highway to *Byron Bay* for our lunch stop. We can take some time to look around before we head home and complete a fantastic time away.
