Booking Information

Acceptance of T & C's It is understood by East Coast Coaches that all T&C's are accepted by the passenger when a deposit is paid.

Bookings Cancellations and Refunds Bookings can be made by completing a booking form and returning it to Doyle's Coaches with the required deposit. Reservations can only be held for 7days without deposit. Final Payment is due 30 Days prior to departure. East Coast Coaches retains the right to cancel a tour due to insufficient numbers or unforeseen circumstances. In this instance either a substitute date or full refund will be offered.

Cancellation Policy The following fees apply according to notice given— 30 days prior to departure of tour, forfeit of deposit only 21 days or less full forfeit. Where a non-refundable ticket has been purchased this will be in addition to cancellation fee.

Tour Costs Tour Prices are current at time of Printing but subject to change without notice for unforeseen circumstances such as, Higher motel costs, Venues closing and replacing them with more expensive venues. All tour costs include GST. Tour price excludes drinks, telephone calls, mini bars, insurance and personal items.

General Conditions Seats cannot be reserved on tours. However, It is East Coast Coaches policy to rotate seats daily to ensure all passengers will enjoy seating.

Single Supplement & Travelling Alone A limited number of single rooms are available on each trip. Addition cost occurs for the sole use of a room

3 Day Canberra Explorer

Day 1: BRISBANE TO CANBERRA (L,D)

Today we head to Brisbane airport to connect with our flight to our nation's capital – Canberra! We'll be met on arrival and head straight for lunch at Rodney's Garden Cafe. After lunch we'll take a drive around Canberra accompanied by a local expert. Our tour will take in the many civic buildings as well as *Embassy Row*. We'll conclude the days sightseeing with a trip to the top of Mt. Ainslie where we can see Canberra in its entire splendor! We can also see in panorama the design concepts translated into tangibles by Walter Burley Griffin. We then check into our inner city accommodation on Northbourne Avenue – our base for the next 3 nights

Day 2: THE AUSTRALIAN WAR MEMORIAL(BD)

We have an easy morning before we transfer across to the Australian War Memorial. This memorial commemorates the sacrifice of the Australian men and women, who have served in war, through its ceremonial areas, extensive exhibitions and research facilities. Over the past few years the Memorial has undergone extensive redevelopment resulting in new galleries and displays. The largest of these is the very impressive Anzac Hall which has a number of must-see exhibits. You can easily lose yourself in the galleries and displays and time can run away with you, so we have the option to spend the day here or, this afternoon visit the Mount Annan Botanic Garden, the native plant garden of the Royal Botanic Gardens. Later in the afternoon we return to the Australian War Memorial where the focus will be the Hall of Memory together with the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, the Pool of Reflection and the Roll of Honour that lists the names of over 102,000 Australian servicemen and women who have died in war. It is here we'll hear the moving last post and closing ceremony.

Day 3: PARLEMENT HOUSE AND LAKE BURLEIGH GRIFFIN(B,D,L)

Mid-morning, we take a guided tour of Parliament House. Located in the heart of Canberra, it is one of the world's most acclaimed buildings. It's renowned for its impressive architecture and magnificent artworks. The building features superb stone work and Australian timber. Following the tour, we have some free time to further explore the galleries and have lunch in the Café. This afternoon we join Southern Cross Cruises for a delightful sightseeing cruise on Lake Burley Griffin. The cruise is the perfect way to see some of Canberra's biggest attractions on Lake Burley Griffin. It has informative commentary about the National Capital which we can take in whilst enjoying a cuppa.

Day 4: RETURN HOME OR STAY ON?(B,L)

This morning we visit the **Royal Australian Mint**. The first task of the mint was to produce new coins for the introduction of decimal currency on 14 February 1966. Since then it has produced more than thirteen billion circulating coins. It now has capacity to produce two million coins per day. The Mint also manufactures medals, medallions, seals and tokens for private and public sectors and sporting and tourism groups, both nationally and internationally. Examples of these are The Order of Australia, Third Pacific Conference Games Medallions, Sydney Monorail token and Conrad Jupiter's Casino tokens. From here we make our way to the airport to connect with our mid-day flight home to Brisbane.
