Acceptance of T & C's It is understood by East Coast Coaches that all T&C's are accepted by the passenger when a deposit is paid.

Bookings Cancellations and Refunds Bookings can be made by completing a booking form and returning it to Doyle's Coaches with the required deposit. Reservations can only be held for 7days without deposit. Final Payment is due 30 Days prior to departure. East Coast Coaches retains the right to cancel a tour due to insufficient numbers or unforeseen circumstances. In this instance either a substitute date or full refund will be offered.

Cancellation Policy The following fees apply according to notice given— 30 days prior to departure of tour, forfeit of deposit only 21 days or less full forfeit. Where a non-refundable ticket has been purchased this will be in addition to cancellation fee.

Tour Costs Tour Prices are current at time of Printing but subject to change without notice for unforeseen circumstances such as, Higher motel costs, Venues closing and replacing them with more expensive venues. All tour costs include GST. Tour price excludes drinks, telephone calls, mini bars, insurance and personal items.

General Conditions Seats cannot be reserved on tours. However, It is East Coast Coaches policy to rotate seats daily to ensure all passengers will enjoy seating.

Day 1 Monday 10th October 2022 Home to Mundubbera (L,D)

Sit back and relax as we head north on our Rockhampton and 1770 tour. We hit the road and make our way to Kingaroy. We all know what Kingaroy is famous for so it's appropriate to make a stop at Kingaroy's most famous tourist attraction – the Peanut Van! It was established in 1969 and now, each year nearly 40 tonnes of peanuts are sold through this unique retail outlet. We enjoy lunch before travelling on to Mundubbera, known to many as the Citrus Capital of Queensland and home to The Big Mandarin. The area around Mundubbera produces over one third of Queensland's citrus fruit and boasts the largest single citrus orchard in the Southern Hemisphere. (Lunch in Kingaroy / dinner at the motel)

Day 2 Tuesday 11th October 2022 Mundubbera to Rockhampton (B,D)

Leaving Mundubbera this morning we travel to on to Monto. Here we visit the latest of the Queensland Silo art collection the Three Moon Silo, completed in 2020 depicting the Three Moons story, about the Gooreng Gooreng people and how they used to help farmers move cattle. Because they did not speak the same language, the farmer would tell them to 'come back in three moons'. The silo art depicts a portrait of this elder telling the story to his granddaughter who sits beside him in this huge mural. Venturing into the town of Monto, we'll take in the extraordinary street art including the Curious Cow, the legendary Cheryl and the Monto Water Tower, amongst others. Our destination today is Rockhampton, where on arrival we can unpack and settle in as this will be home for the next 3 nights. (Breakfast and dinner in the motel/ lunch own arrangements and cost)

Day 3 Wednesday 12th October 2022 Rockhampton (B,L,D)

We discover the railway history of the region this morning at the Archer Park Rail Museum, which houses some very interesting rolling stock. After spending time listening to our guide as they reveal the stories behind the displays, we head to Koorana Crocodile Farm. We'll uncover this prehistoric creature's behaviour while listening to our guide as we are led through the farm to witness the crocodiles smile as they chomp down on their morning meal. After lunch here, and feeling humbled by the power of these reptiles, we head out of town for a geological treat. Feeling the excitement of venturing into an ancient coral reef cave, we head into the Capricorn Caves and are guided through to the easily accessible Cathedral Cave, while discovering the ancient geological history and special acoustics. What an interesting day we have had! (Breakfast and dinner in hotel, lunch at Koorana Crocodile Farm)

Day 4 Thursday 13th October 2022 Rockhampton (B,L,D)

We spend some time in the beautiful Botanic Gardens, regarded as among the best tropical gardens in regional Australia. Excellent specimens of palms, cycads and ferns are found throughout the beautifully manicured grounds. Later this morning we travel to the coast passing Emu Park where we stop to see the Singing Ship. This distinctive memorial was erected for the James Cook bicentennial celebration and

is inspired by his ship "Endeavour". Not far away is the Anzac Memorial and boardwalk, here we spend time looking at the storyboards before we arrive at Footlights Theatre Restaurant. We not only enjoy a delicious lunch but will be entertained with their comedy show as well, giving us an afternoon of fun and laughter! (Breakfast and dinner in hotel, lunch at Footlights theatre)

Day 5 Friday 14th October 2022 Rockhampton to Agnus Waters (B,D)

After farewelling our hosts, we begin our trip further south. First stop is the town of Gladstone. The city is built around a natural deep-water port and because of this Gladstone was transformed with the start of a major industrial and community expansion which has continued to this day. We will see why Gladstone is often referred to as the Industrial Land of the Giants! It has the world's largest alumina refinery, Australia's largest aluminium smelter, Queensland's biggest power station, Australia's largest cement operation and the State's largest multi-cargo port. However, amongst all the industry giants there is a diamond in the rough being the Art Gallery and Museum, housed in the Heritage Listed old Gladstone Town Hall with a purpose-built extension. We have time here to discover art and history of Gladstone before some free time in town for lunch. Our afternoon has us arriving at Seventeen Seventy where we find our rooms, unpack and make our way to dinner. (Breakfast and dinner in hotel, lunch own arrangement)

Day 6 Saturday 15th October 2022 1770 & Agnus Waters (B,L,D)

Vast sandy beaches and crystal-clear waters await us today as we experience the same magnificent beauty that greeted Lieutenant James Cook when he stepped ashore here more than two centuries ago. The unique amphibious pink vehicle, the LARC, is the perfect way to explore the beautiful secluded beaches in the Southern Great Barrier Reef Region. Back on dry land we enjoy lunch before heading back to Agnes Waters. We visit the museum which will give us some information of the area and a good understanding of why this area is so significant to Australia's history. Our very special final visit of the day is to Horizons Kangaroo Sanctuary. At 3.30pm Garry and Denise, who have dedicated their lives to orphan kangaroos, let us get up close and personal with their beloved kangaroos. We will learn a lot from these experienced carers about how they rehabilitate their guests. (Breakfast and dinner in the Resort, lunch included)

Day 7 Sunday 16th October 2022 Homeward Bound (B,L)

Continuing south today we stop in Maryborough with streets that are lined with the beautiful Queensland style homes. We have a local guide talk us through what makes Maryborough such a special town before an early lunch at the Maryborough RSL Club. Our 7-day tour has come to an end but the memories of Rockhampton and 1770 will last a lifetime. (Breakfast and lunch included)
